INDIAN SCHOOL SUR – A PROFILE

Indian School Sur was founded in 1989 to serve the educational needs of the children of the expatriate Indian community. The school is an English medium Co-educational school. It is a self-financing school and is managed by a committee for the administration under the guidance of the Board of Directors for the Indian Schools in the Sultanate of Oman. The Committee for the school administration is nominated by the Board of Directors, Indian Schools in Oman.

The Indian School Sur is approved by the Ministry of Education, Oman and is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi.

The school building was dedicated to the expatriate community in Sur by H.E Anil Wadhwa on 31st January 2008. The school campus is spread over 6512 m² piece of land in Skekara adjacent to Mariam Mosque. At present, it has 4900 m² of built-up area. The school is excellently landscaped and has an artificial turfed playground. The school has a covered stage equipped with curtains, lights and a sound system.

There are well-equipped Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Computer Science Laboratories. There are 27 classrooms equipped with Smart Televisions and separate rooms for Art, Craft and Music.

The school has a fully computerised library with sufficient number of latest books for reading. The children are allowed to borrow books from the library.

There is an additional audio-visual room with multimedia facilities as well as a multi-purpose hall for conducting different types of curricular and co-curricular activities.

The school has around 1000 students and 58 teaching and non-teaching staff. The school celebrated its Silver Jubilee during 2014-'15.

Fourteen-year education provided by the school consists of the following segments

- Pre-Primary/Kindergarten Section – Lower & Upper Kindergarten
- Primary Section – Classes I, II, III & IV
- Middle Section – Classes V, VI, VII & VIII
- Secondary & Senior Secondary Section – Classes IX, X, XI & XII

The school functions five days a week from Sunday to Thursday

ADMISSION

- The school admits both boys and girls irrespective of their caste, creed and religion. Though the School is primarily intended for the children of parents holding Indian passports, non-Indians are also admitted depending upon the availability of seats.

The Non-Indians have to produce NOC from their respective Embassy for registration and also give an undertaking with the Registration Form. All pupils have to follow the curriculum prescribed by the school.

- The parents seeking admission for their ward should submit the prescribed application form online which is available on the school website (www.indianschoolsur.com). Interactive session / admission test will be conducted for students from schools other than the CBSE affiliated.
- For admission to LKG, a child should have completed 3 ½ years, to UKG 4 ½ years and to Class I, 5½ years as on June 30, 2022. A corresponding minimum age limit is fixed for successive classes.
- Application for admission should be made on the prescribed form by the parents.
- No pupil below 5 years, 4 years or 3 years (on or before 31st March of the current year) will be admitted to Class I, Upper KG, Lower KG respectively. A corresponding scale of age is fixed for successive classes.
- No pupil will be admitted without a transfer certificate from the last school attended and the same must be duly signed by the education officer of the area.
- In no case shall a student be permitted to attend class without formal admission.
- A candidate at the time of admission must produce an official birth certificate or a copy of the passport as evidence of the date of birth.

Documents to be submitted at the time of admission:

TRANSFER CERTIFICATE:

Transfer Certificate should be issued only under the signatures of the Principal /Vice-Principal and it should be countersigned by an officer not below the rank of District Inspector of Schools /Deputy Director of Education / Education Officer of the

Education Department of the State / Union Territory concerned. In case of a student migrating from a CBSE affiliated School, the schools shall mention in the Transfer Certificate **AFFILIATED TO THE CENTRAL BOARD OF SECONDARY EDUCATION** below the name and address of the school along with the Affiliation Code No. [Applicable for the admission to Classes II to XII only]

- ✓ A copy of the fee paid receipt.
- ✓ Two recent passport size photographs of the child and parents. [**For all classes**]
- ✓ Photocopy of child's passport and parent's passport with its first page, visa page and last page and copies of Resident Card. [**For all classes**]
- ✓ Copy of the last Progress Report issued by the previous school.

[For classes II onwards]

- ✓ Photocopy of Immunization record of the child.
- ✓ In addition to the above, Non-Indian Students should submit the
 - ✓ NOC from the respective Embassy
 - ✓ Undertaking by the parent (will be given from school)
- ✓ If any document is found invalid, admission will be cancelled without any explanation.

Kindly note the following:

- Kindly submit a photocopy of the passport, visa and the resident card of the student and parents to the school office whenever renewed, to update the records in the personal files.

WITHDRAWALS

- Application for withdrawal should be submitted in writing to the Principal.
- A calendar months' notice is to be given before the withdrawal or else a fee will be charged.
- Transfer certificate will be issued only if all dues to the school have been paid in full.
- For duplicate of any extract or any additional certificate on demand from the school register, R.O. 1.000 will be charged.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR THE PARENTS/GUARDIANS

Attention of Parents/guardians of the children studying in Indian Schools in Oman are invited to the following for their information and adherence, as per the Bylaw of the Indian Schools in Oman, approved by the Ministry of Education (MOE), Sultanate of Oman.

1. Related to Board of directors of Indian schools (BOD)

- a) The schools are established by the BOD primarily to impart good education and value system to students of Indian Community in the Sultanate of Oman.
- b) The BOD is the apex committee which is the custodian of all Indian schools and promoters are the custodians of their respective schools.
- c) BOD shall be the authority responsible for representing the Schools before the Ministry of Education and other Ministries in Oman. Parents/guardians are not to overstep/circumvent this authority.
- d) It is one of the important functions of the BOD to monitor the overall operation of the schools in order to ensure the financial viability of each school. The BOD may take timely action, if in its opinion the viability of the school is at risk.
- e) BOD at its discretion may take steps from time to time to enhance the infrastructure and the processes and in case if required, effect a revision in the fee structure with proper notice and as per the bylaw.
- f) That the schools are established and functioning **FOR** the Indian community facilitated **BY** the **Board of Directors**.
- g) The bylaws very clearly stipulate the election of parent representatives in the BOD, and also stipulate nomination of parent representation in the SMCs. Hence, other than those elected/nominated members as per bylaw, no one else is authorised to act as a representative of the parents and whoever doing so is acting against the bylaw. Also forming any **non-registered** parent associations is illegal as per the law of the land.

2. Related to School Management Committee (SMC)

- a) Individual Indian schools are managed by the School Management Committees

(SMC), which are appointed to function as per the bylaws. Parents/guardians shall not interfere in the day to day functioning of the SMC. In case of any grievance by an individual parent against the SMC, they may follow the grievance address system in place.

3. Compliance with laws & regulations.

- a) Parents/guardians are to note that no action of theirs or their family members should explicitly or implicitly contravene the laws of the Sultanate of Oman or malign the image or hurt the sentiments of the people of Sultanate of Oman.

4. Related to School administration

- a) The school administration will be responsible for the day to day running of the school and other functions.
- b) Parents/guardians are not to interfere in the day-to-day functioning of the schools including administration, academics and organisational matters.

5. Interactions with teachers and staff

- a) Parents/guardians may discuss any matter concerning their wards with their respective teacher(s), at the allotted time and at designated areas within the campus.
- b) Parents/guardians are not to resort to any act, which may hurt verbally or physically any staff of the school. If found in violation, then the school has the right to take legal and police action besides issuing a transfer certificate to the respective child.
- c) Parents/guardians will not resort to any instigative action and will respect the rules and regulations set out in the bylaws.

6. Grievance & Redress

- a) Parents/guardians are to use the school's grievance addressing mechanism for any concerns they may have and if the matter is not addressed satisfactorily, they may then approach the School Management Committee in writing. In case the matter still remains unresolved, parents/guardians may approach the Board of Directors who shall be the final authority for the redress. Parents can send their concerns to grievance@indianschoolsur.com

7. Image of the Indian Schools

- a) Parents/guardians shall not be a party, under any circumstances, to tarnish the image of the school through any medium.
- b) Parents/guardians are to be aware that use of social media websites is governed by the laws of Sultanate of Oman. If the media is not used diligently, it may lead to legal implications.

8. Fee payment

Parents/guardians are to pay all fees on time. In case of temporary non-payment of fees, they should inform the school authorities and request for a rescheduling of the same or apply for the fee concession scheme in vogue and will adhere to the mutually agreed terms as discussed with the school. If they do not comply with any of the above in spite of three reminders/warnings then the school shall have the right to issue transfer certificate to the child concerned.

9. Disciplinary Action against non-compliance.

Parents/guardians are expected to adhere to the above general guidelines for the smooth functioning of the schools and the schools have the right to:

- a) Intimate and warn about the non-compliance to the concerned parent in writing by the school administration, with a copy to the SMC.
- b) Issue a second warning letter by the SMC, with a copy to the school administration.
- c) If there are no response/corrective actions from the parent/guardian, issue a transfer certificate for the ward, without further warnings. In the event of a TC being issued, BOD will be kept informed by the school explaining the circumstances with appropriate evidence of prior warnings.

10. Transportation

Buses will ply on selected routes only, provided there is a minimum of 10 children.

FEE STRUCTURE & PAYMENT

- ❖ **SCHOOL FEE:** Tuition fee is payable for 12 calendar months. The fee should be paid by the 30th of every month in the Bank / CDM / Zoment App (Online payment gateway) and the same should be informed to the class teacher. Otherwise, a late fee of R.O. 2 per month will be charged.

CONCESSIONS

Concession in fee is granted to a limited number of deserving cases for one year only and as a rule, not granted at the time of admission.

- * If the child fails in all subjects, the concession will be withdrawn.

CURRICULUM:

The school is an English medium, co-education school and is affiliated to CBSE New Delhi (India).

The school follows the CBSE syllabus prescribed by the board, which includes the following subjects.

Languages: 1st - English

LKG – XII

2nd - Hindi

I – IV

2nd - Hindi/Arabic/ Malayalam

V – X

3rd - Hindi/ Arabic/ Malayalam

V – VIII

Scholastic Subjects: MATHEMATICS, GENERAL SCIENCE, SOCIAL SCIENCE.

Co- Scholastic Subjects: ART EDUCATION, PHYSICAL AND HEALTH EDUCATION, WORK EXPERIENCE.

In addition to academic curriculum, the students have the following co-curricular activities like **SPORTS & GAMES, DANCE, MUSIC, LIBRARY AND ART**. In addition, the students of classes III - XII are involved in various clubs like Entrepreneurship, IT, Literary, Language (Malayalam and Hindi), Math, Science, UN, Yoga, and Quiz.

The academic year begins in April and ends in March with two Terms.

First Term: April – September

Second Term: October - March

PROMOTION RULES

1. For promotion to the next class, the child should have attended a minimum 75% of the total number of working days of his/her class in the school.
2. Students remaining absent for the assessment will not be awarded any marks.
3. Students who use unfair means in any test / examination will be awarded zero in that subject.
4. For appearing for the final examination, all the school dues should be cleared by the 10th of February.
5. For **General Proficiency Award**: A student who remains absent in any assessment will not be eligible for General Proficiency Award.
6. The student's performance for each subject will be assessed using the actual marks scored and the same will be later converted into the grades as detailed below.

Promotion policy for Class XI

- To be promoted to the next class a student should secure minimum 35% marks in each of the five Scholastic subjects in the Final Examination and in the subject aggregate.
- A student should secure a grade above E in all the Non-Scholastic subjects.
- A student should secure minimum of 35% marks in theory and practical examinations separately, if the subject involves practicals.
- A student will be allowed for improvement exam in any one of the five scholastic subjects if he/she secure less than 35% in that subject and gets minimum of 40% marks in aggregate.

- A nine-point scale is followed for converting marks into grade for classes IX to XII. The grades are derived from actual score of the student. The nine grades are awarded after rank ordering all the students in the class.
- This is done separately for each subject as follows:
 - A1- Top 1/8th of passed candidates
 - A2- Next 1/8th of passed candidates
 - B1- Next 1/8th of passed candidates
 - B2- Next 1/8th of passed candidates
 - C1- Next 1/8th of passed candidates
 - C2- Next 1/8th of passed candidates
 - D1- Next 1/8th of passed candidates
 - D2- Next 1/8th of passed candidates
 - E – Needs to improve

ABSENCE

1. No student should leave the school premises during school hours without the prior permission of the Principal.
2. Students not returning punctually after the holidays, without prior permission are liable to have their names strike off the rolls.
3. All leave applications should bear the signature of the parent/ guardian.
4. A student who has been absent for a month without valid reason and permission is liable to have his/her name strike off without advance notice. If in such a case, re-admission is sought then, he/she will be considered as fresh admission.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS:

1. Without the help and co-operation of parents and guardians it is not possible to mould the child's character and develop his/her personality. Therefore, the parents are requested to ensure that the children strictly follow rules of the school.
2. Parents should ensure that their children leave home in time to be punctual in school, wear neat and full uniform, complete the work given to them and participate in co-curricular activities.
3. Parents should check and sign the progress reports. Parents should refer to the child's calendar daily and sign, if any remark is given.
4. Parents must develop the habit of meeting the teachers once a month with prior permission.
5. If a student is absent for more than three days due to illness/sickness, the parent is requested to submit a medical certificate, and the same should be intimated to the class teacher concerned through an Email.
6. When communicating with the Principal, Parents must mention the standard in which the child is studying.
7. Parents/Guardians or any other person are not allowed to see the students or communicate with the teachers during school hours without the Principal's permission.
8. Parents are expected to see that their children are taken home immediately after the school hours. They should not be left at school beyond 10 minutes after school hours. They are not allowed to remain in the campus unless they are accompanied by a teacher involved in school activity assigned by school authorities.
9. The parents/guardians should kindly read the rules in this calendar. Attention is specially drawn to the rules regarding attendance, discipline, reports, parental cooperation and payment of fees. Ignorance shall not be an excuse for any lapse.
10. Parents should send a duly signed request seeking permission in the diary to the class teacher, if they need to take their child out of the school during school hours. The child can wait for the parent during the interval in the front office
