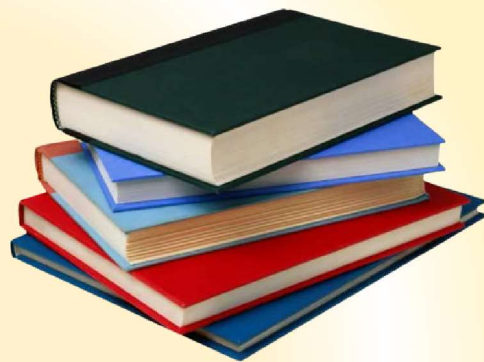
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BOOKS – THE RIDE INTO MAGIC

so that someone else can take the words from me

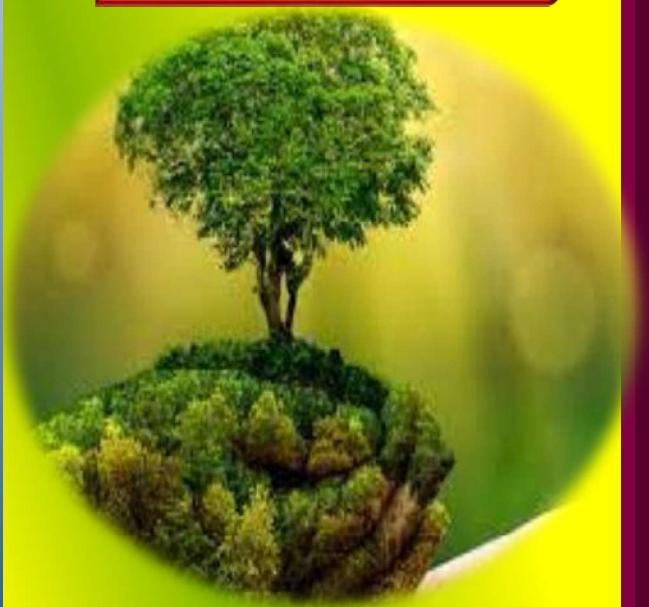
Sometimes my planes fly and sometimes they die but

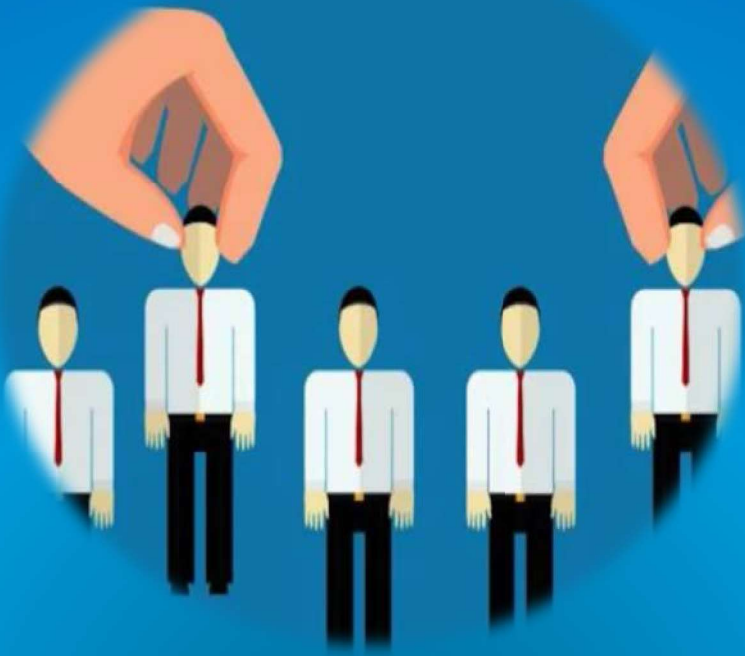

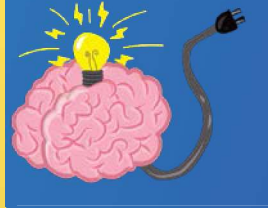

It works to address major issues related to the global economy, such as international financial stability, climate change mitigation, and sustainable development. 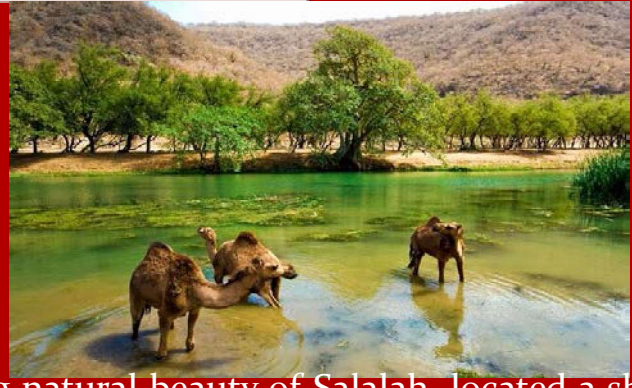
FACTS ABOUT RAIN FOREST

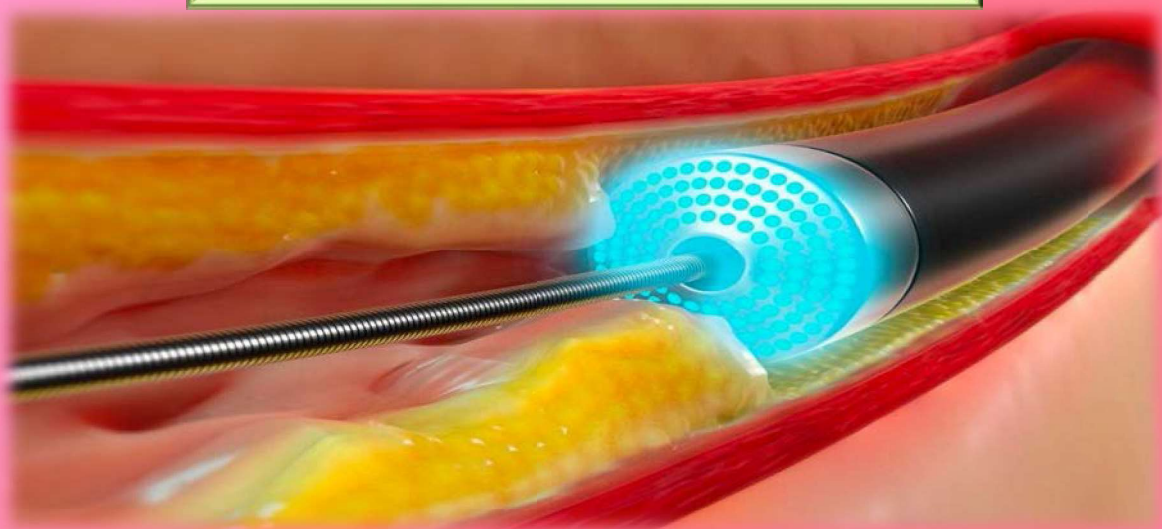

LASER TO VAPOURISE HEART VESSELS' BLOCKAGES



On Sunday 12th February 2023 , a newest therapy was introduced in central India to remove blockages in heart vessels through laser gun.

*Dr Praveen Chandra from **Medanta Hospital** spoke about laser therapy in which a catheter that emits high energy light is used to unblock arteries. It vapourises blockages and clears vessels without hurting the walls of vessels. This laser gun treats blockages of arteries due to the fatty deposition. Doctors make a small incision in the patient's groin and insert a wire with laser. Laser treatment is a minimally invasive surgical procedure to re-open blood vessels to allow smooth flow of oxygen rich blood. The catheter is manoeuvred through the vessel until it reaches the blockage. Some of the 55 cases were succesful using the laser technology. Using the laser gun it is easier for doctors to deliver stents and balloons if they are required in the coming future. This also ensures the perfect positioning of the stents. Sometimes, the lumen of the vessel reduces after angioplasty (The term "angioplasty" means using a balloon to stretch open a narrowed or blocked artery).*

By the usage of laser guns, the patients might feel more comfortable due to less discomfort. It reduces the time taken for recovery and hospital stays, the process doesn't take much time.

ROBOTIC ARM



Robotic arms consist of several segments and joints. To enable precise movement the arm is fitted with step motors at each joint. Number of joints determine the arm's degrees of freedom, which refer to the different directions the arm can pivot. Robotic arms mount to a stationary base, which often have the step motor to swivel the arm along the vertical axis. Attached to the end of arm, a device called the end effector serves as robot's hand and performs specific task, such as cutting, welding, painting or gripping.

In addition to that, every robotic arm needs a software to determine the task it performs and how it moves. Many robots have a specific unchanging task such as screwing two components together. Other robotic arms perform more complicated tasks that require more intelligent interaction with their environment. Although many recent robotic arm applications implement artificial intelligence, AI and robotics are two separate technological fields. The field of robotics includes the study and science of designing, manufacturing and deploying robots – automated machines that perform specific tasks.

AI algorithms normally mimic human problem-solving processes. For example, neural network algorithms use a collection of dynamic decision- making nodes that resemble the neurons and neural pathways in the human brain. For more sophisticated operations, AI allows the technology to perform intricate and dynamic tasks, often with superhuman accuracy. Robotic arms that perform welding and cutting operations for product assembly also rely on AI to adapt to the smallest micro-level tolerances in each component. Since each set of components may need to be cut and welded slightly differently, AI helps the robot change its approach each time it performs a task to create the best product

In the last few years, we have seen how AI has not only added new functionality to the apps and services we use every day but also have begun to drastically increase the capabilities of robotics technology.
