32ND ANNUAL ATHLETIC MEET

The 32nd Annual Athletic Meet of Indian School Sur unfolded its grandeur at the Sur Sports Complex on the 3rd and 4th of December 2023. The two-day spectacle commenced with a mesmerizing opening ceremony, graced by the presence of the esteemed chief guest, Mr. Khalid Bin Hamad Al Orimi, Asst. Director of Sur Sports Complex along with Mr. Jami Srinivasa Rao, President; Dr. Ramkumar, Convenor, Mr. Pradeep, Convenor, SMC. The inaugural festivities were marked by the impressive march past of the four houses, led by their respective house captains carrying the proud flags. Following this, a torch run ensued, culminating in the ceremonial lighting of the flame, orchestrated by the house sports captains and the school's sports secretary. The opening ceremony's welcome address was eloquently delivered by the sports secretary, Master Shahadhat, setting the tone for an eventful two-day extravaganza. Day one showcased riveting performances by the school's emerging athletes, as track events unfolded with precision and flair. The events were organized in two sessions, a morning session from 7 AM to 11 AM, and an evening session from 3 PM to 6 PM.

The first day's highlights included the gripping finals of the eight hundred meter race across all categories. The second day, however, took center stage with a remarkable display of tenacity and stamina in the three thousand meter long-distance run, performed by the marathoners. The final session and closing ceremony were graced by the esteemed presence of Mr. Khalid Ali Saod Ali al Jabari, Maintenance Head of the Ministry of Culture, Youth &





Sports. The ceremony, made auspicious by the participation of the school's management committee members, including Mr. Jami Srinivasa Rao, President; Mr. Pardeep, Convener; and Mrs. Nishreen Basheer, Member, SMC, featured the march past of the four houses, followed by captivating mass yoga demonstration by parents and students. As Mr. Khalid Ali Saod Ali al Jabari lowered the flag and officially declared the conclusion of the sports meet, the prize distribution ceremony took center stage. The Blue house, propelled by the exceptional sporting prowess of its members, clinched both the championship trophy and the athletics trophy for the 32nd Annual Athletic Meet of Indian School Sur. The Green house secured the trophy for the best team in games, while the Red house claimed the trophy for the best march past.

Individual champions in all categories were duly recognized with trophies and medals. Mast. Sidharth Pradeep of class eleven was celebrated as the fastest athlete among senior boys, while Miss. Prianthi Barua of class twelve earned the title of the fastest athlete among senior girls. Uthara Abhilash Nair of class nine was honored with the prestigious title of the best athlete of the year 2023-24, acknowledging her exceptional track record in both inter and intra-school sporting events. FIELD TRIPS

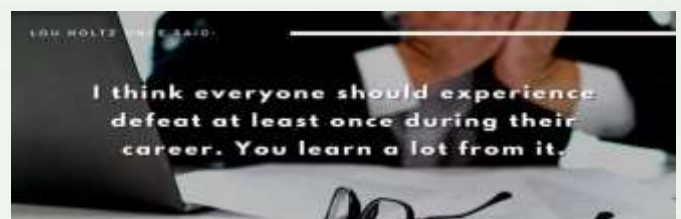

APICULTURE WORKSHOP

The students of Indian School Sur had the unique opportunity to participate in a beekeeping workshop conducted by the Ministry of Environment Oman in the Al Sharaqia district. The educational event offered students a hands-on experience that enriched their understanding of the importance of bees and their role in preserving the environment. The workshop commenced with a brief introduction to the significance of bees in our ecosystem. The Ministry of Environment Oman provided a comprehensive overview of beekeeping, highlighting the critical role bees play in pollination, and subsequently, the propagation of fruits and vegetables. The students were captivated by the intricate world of bees and as the day progressed, the students were also educated about the

environmental challenges facing bees. The Ministry of Environment Oman emphasized the importance of conservation efforts, including planting pollinator-friendly plants and reducing pesticide use. Students were encouraged to become bee advocates in their community, spreading awareness about the essential role that bees play in our food chain and ecosystems. The workshop also integrated discussions on sustainable honey production and the economic potential of beekeeping, highlighting how it can be a source of livelihood for local communities. 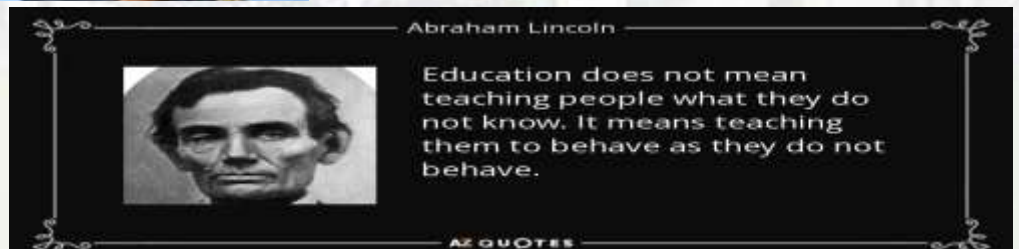

SPORTS COMPETITIONS

The CBSE Oman Cluster competitions, a hallmark event for Indian School Sur, unfolded from 4th October 2023 to 21st October, spanning across various venues in Oman. This year, the school showcased exemplary sportsmanship and skill across an array of individual events and games.

On 5th October 2023, the CBSE Oman clusters girls' football tournament, hosted by Indian School Al Mabela, witnessed a closely contested match where our team displayed commendable prowess despite the 1-0 score in favor of Indian School Boucher.

Subsequently, on 7th October 2023, Indian School Boucher assumed the role of host for the CBSE Oman clusters competition. Our athletes' formidable performance in the pool resulted in a staggering total of 32 medals, including 7 Gold, 9 Silver, and 16 Bronze. Five of our outstanding participants clinched berths in the prestigious CBSE National competitions to be held at Rishikul Vidya Peeth, Sonapat, India.

In a spirited display of sportsmanship on the 6th and 7th of October 2023, Indian School Wadhi Al Kabir and Indian School Muscat played host to the handball and chess competitions respectively, for both boys and girls across various categories. Our handball boys exhibited grit and determination, securing the third position with a scoreline of 10-12 against Indian School Al Gubra. Similarly, our handball girls, while narrowly missing victory, demonstrated relentless tenacity in a match against Indian School Muscat that concluded with a score of 6-8. In chess, our under-17 girls' team clinched the second position, solidifying their place in the upcoming CBSE National competition to be held at Gyanshree School, Noida, India, while our under-14 girls' team secured an admirable third position.

On the 9th of October 2023, Indian School Muscat played host to the CBSE Oman clusters table tennis competition. Our under-17 girls' team exhibited exceptional prowess, clinching the second position and a well-deserved qualification for the forthcoming CBSE Nationals at NRI Global School, Bhopal. Although our under-17 boys' team faced a challenging match against Indian School Al Mabela, their spirited performance was indicative of the school's commitment to sportsmanship.





The fervor continued on the 11th & 12th of October 2023, as Indian School Sohar hosted the CBSE Oman clusters badminton competition. The under-17 girls' team, through their formidable display, secured the second position and earned the right to represent the school at the CBSE Nationals, to be hosted at Jhunjhunu Academy, Rajasthan.

A gripping match on the 13th of October 2023, hosted by Indian School Salalah, saw our boys' football team engage in an intense penalty shootout against Indian School Al-Gubra. Despite a narrow 5-4 loss, the match was a testament to the indomitable spirit of our players.

The 16th & 17th of October 2023 witnessed Indian School Wadhi Al Kabir hosting the CBSE Oman clusters basketball competition. Both our girls' and boys' teams displayed commendable teamwork and skill, even though they faced losses in the first round.

The battle continued on the 18th and 19th of October 2023, hosted by Indian School Nizwa, in the form of the CBSE Oman

clusters kho-kho competition. Our boys' team exhibited exceptional tenacity, securing the second position with a slender score of 12-13 against Indian School Al-Mabela, earning them a coveted spot in the nationals at Suditi Global Academy, Uttar Pradesh. Simultaneously, our girls' team demonstrated remarkable effort in a closely contested match against Indian School Salalah, ultimately falling short with a score of 10-11.

The culmination of the event transpired on the 20th & 21st of October 2023, hosted by Indian School Muscat, where our school shone in the CBSE Oman clusters athletics competition. Securing a total of 10 medals, including 3 golds, our athletes secured qualification for the CBSE Nationals at Jhunjhunu Academy, Rajasthan.

The Indian School Sur community extends its heartfelt congratulations to all participants for their unyielding dedication and commendable performances, showcasing the true spirit of sportsmanship.

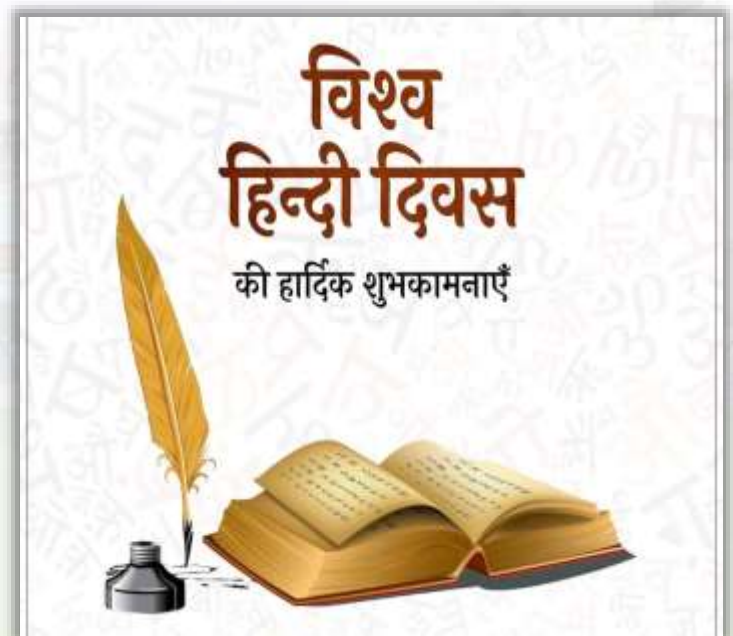

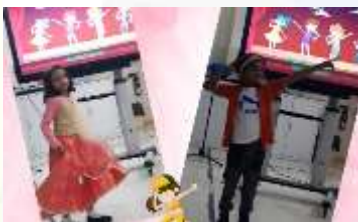
