

INDIAN SCHOOL SUR – A PROFILE

Indian School Sur was founded in 1989 to serve the educational needs of the children of the expatriate Indian community. A self-financing, English medium Co-educational institution managed by a committee for the administration under the guidance of the Board of Directors for the Indian Schools in the Sultanate of Oman. The Committee for the school administration is nominated by the Board of Directors, Indian Schools in Oman. The School is approved by the Ministry of Education, Oman and is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi.

The school building was dedicated to the expatriate community in Sur by H.E Anil Wadhwa on 31st January 2008. The campus is spread over 6512 m² piece of land in Skekara adjacent to Mariam Mosque, with a built-up area of 7000 m². The school is excellently landscaped and has a natural grass playground and a state-of-the-art multipurpose hall equipped with all facilities.

The infrastructure includes well-equipped Physics, Chemistry, Biology Computer Science and Innovation Laboratories. There are 27 classrooms equipped with Smart Televisions and separate rooms for Art, Craft and Music. The school has a fully computerized library with sufficient number of latest books for reading. The children are allowed to borrow books from the library. There is an old multipurpose hall for conducting different types of curricular and co-curricular activities. Blending technology with a personal touch, our Kindergarten and primary classrooms feature integrated smart boards, supporting a vibrant community of over 1100 students and 60 dedicated staff members. The school celebrated its Silver Jubilee during 2014-'15.

The fourteen-year educational journey provided by the school consists of the following segments

- Foundation Stage – Balvatika 1 to Class II (age 3 to 8)
- Preparatory Stage – Classes III to V (age 8 to 11)
- Middle Stage – Classes VI to VIII (age 11 to 14)
- Secondary Stage – Classes IX to XII (age 14 to 18)

The school functions five days a week from Sunday to Thursday. The parents can meet the teachers on first Saturday of every month from 9.00 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

ADMISSION

- The school admits both boys and girls irrespective of their caste, creed and religion. Though the School is primarily intended for the children of parents holding Indian passports, non-Indians are also admitted depending upon the availability of seats.

The non-Indians have to produce NOC from their respective Embassy for registration and also give an undertaking with the Registration Form. All pupils have to follow the curriculum prescribed by the school.

- The parents seeking admission for their ward should submit the prescribed application form online which is available on the school website (www.indianschoolsur.com). Interactive session / admission test will be conducted for students from schools other than the CBSE affiliated.
- For admission to LKG, a child should have completed 3 ½ years, to UKG 4 ½ years and to Class I, 5½ years as on June 30, 2025. A corresponding minimum age limit is fixed for successive classes.
- Application for admission should be made on the prescribed form by the parents.
- No pupil below 5 years, 4 years or 3 years (on or before 31st March of the current year) will be admitted to Class I, Upper KG, Lower KG respectively. A corresponding scale of age is fixed for successive classes.
- No pupil will be admitted without a transfer certificate from the last school attended and the same must be duly signed by the education officer of the area.
- In no case shall a student be permitted to attend class without formal admission.
- A candidate at the time of admission must produce an official birth certificate or a copy of the passport as evidence of the date of birth.

Documents to be submitted at the time of admission:

TRANSFER CERTIFICATE:

Transfer Certificate should be issued only under the signatures of the Principal / Vice-Principal and it should be countersigned by an officer not below the rank of District Inspector of Schools /Deputy Director of Education / Education Officer of the Education Department of the State / Union Territory concerned. In case of a student

migrating from a CBSE affiliated School, the schools shall mention in the Transfer Certificate **AFFILIATED TO THE CENTRAL BOARD OF SECONDARY EDUCATION** below the name and address of the school along with the Affiliation Code No. [Applicable for the admission to Classes II to XII only]

- ✓ A copy of the fee paid receipt.
- ✓ Two recent passport size photographs of the child and parents. [**For all classes**]
- ✓ Photocopy of child's passport and parent's passport with its first page, visa page and last page and copies of Resident Card. [**For all classes**]
- ✓ Copy of the last Progress Report issued by the previous school.
[For classes II onwards]
- ✓ Photocopy of Immunization record of the child.
- ✓ In addition to the above, Non-Indian Students should submit the
 - ✓ NOC from the respective Embassy
 - ✓ Undertaking by the parent (will be given from school)
- ✓ If any document is found invalid, admission will be cancelled without any explanation.

Kindly note the following:

- Kindly submit a photocopy of the passport, visa and the resident card of the student and parents to the school office whenever renewed, to update the records in the personal files.

WITHDRAWALS

- Application for withdrawal should be submitted in writing to the Principal.
- A calendar months' notice is to be given before the withdrawal or else a fee will be charged.
- Transfer certificate will be issued only if all dues to the school have been paid in full.
- For duplicate of any extract or any additional certificate on demand from the school register, R.O. 1.000 will be charged.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR THE PARENTS/GUARDIANS

Attention of Parents/guardians of the children studying in Indian Schools in Oman are invited to the following for their information and adherence, as per the Bylaws of the Indian Schools in Oman, approved by the Ministry of Education (MOE), Sultanate of Oman.

1. Related to Board of Directors of Indian schools (BOD)

- a) The schools are established by the BOD primarily to impart good education and value system to students of Indian Community in the Sultanate of Oman.
- b) The BOD is the apex committee which is the custodian of all Indian schools and promoters are the custodians of their respective schools.
- c) BOD shall be the authority responsible for representing the Schools before the Ministry of Education and other Ministries in Oman. Parents/guardians are not to overstep/circumvent this authority.
- d) It is one of the important functions of the BOD to monitor the overall operation of the schools in order to ensure the financial viability of each school. The BOD may take timely action, if in its opinion the viability of the school is at risk.
- e) BOD at its discretion may take steps from time to time to enhance the infrastructure and the processes and in case if required, effect a revision in the fee structure with proper notice and as per the bylaws.
- f) That the schools are established and functioning **FOR** the Indian community facilitated **BY** the **Board of Directors**.
- g) The bylaws very clearly stipulate the election of parent representatives in the BOD, and also stipulate nomination of parent representation in the SMCs. Hence, other than those elected/nominated members as per bylaw, no one else is authorised to act as a representative of the parents and whoever doing so is acting against the bylaws. Also forming any **non-registered** parent associations is illegal as per the law of the land.

2. Related to School Management Committee (SMC)

Individual Indian schools are managed by the School Management Committees (SMC), which are appointed to function as per the bylaws. Parents/guardians

shall not interfere in the day-to-day functioning of the SMC. In case of any grievance by an individual parent against the SMC, they may follow the grievance address system in place.

3. Compliance with laws & regulations.

- a) Parents/guardians are to note that no action of theirs or their family members should explicitly or implicitly contravene the laws of the Sultanate of Oman or malign the image or hurt the sentiments of the people of Sultanate of Oman.

4. Related to School administration

- a) The school administration will be responsible for the day to day running of the school and other functions.
- b) Parents/guardians are not to interfere in the day-to-day functioning of the schools including administration, academics and organisational matters.

5. Interactions with teachers and staff

- a) Parents/guardians may discuss any matter concerning their wards with their respective teacher(s), at the allotted time and at designated areas within the campus.
- b) Parents/guardians are not to resort to any act, which may hurt verbally or physically any staff of the school. If found in violation, then the school has the right to take legal and police action besides issuing a transfer certificate to the respective child.
- c) Parents/guardians will not resort to any instigative action and will respect the rules and regulations set out in the bylaws.

6. Grievance & Redress

- a) Parents/guardians are to use the school's grievance addressing mechanism for any concerns they may have and if the matter is not addressed satisfactorily, they may then approach the School Management Committee in writing. In case the matter still remains unresolved, parents/guardians may approach the Board of Directors who shall be the final authority for the redress. Parents can send their concerns to grievance@indianschoolsur.com

7. Image of the Indian Schools

- a) Parents/guardians shall not be a party, under any circumstances, to tarnish the image of the school through any medium.
- b) Parents/guardians are to be aware that use of social media websites is governed by the laws of Sultanate of Oman. If the media is not used diligently, it may lead to legal implications.

8. Fee payment

Parents/guardians are to pay all fees on time. In case of temporary non-payment of fees, they should inform the school authorities and request for a rescheduling of the same or apply for the fee concession scheme in vogue and will adhere to the mutually agreed terms as discussed with the school. If they do not comply with any of the above in spite of three reminders/warnings then the school shall have the right to issue transfer certificate to the child concerned.

9. Disciplinary Action against non-compliance.

Parents/guardians are expected to adhere to the above general guidelines for the smooth functioning of the schools and the schools have the right to:

- a) Intimate and warn about the non-compliance to the concerned parent in writing by the school administration, with a copy to the SMC.
- b) Issue a second warning letter by the SMC, with a copy to the school administration.
- c) If there are no response/corrective actions from the parent/guardian, issue a transfer certificate for the ward, without further warnings. In the event of a TC being issued, BOD will be kept informed by the school explaining the circumstances with appropriate evidence of prior warnings.

10. Transportation

Buses will ply on selected routes only, provided there is a minimum of 10 children (per bus / per route).

Internal Assessments

- **Periodic Test Classes III - X:**

Classes III - V: School will conduct Periodic Test for 20 marks. Continuous assessments will be done throughout the year

Classes VI - X: Period Test: School will conduct Periodic Test for 20 marks which will be reduced to 5 marks

- **Multiple Assessment: Classes VI - X:**

These will be conducted periodically to test the cognitive skills of the students, through various modes of testing such as quizzes, oral tests, concept map, exit cards, visual expression etc. for 5 marks per term and the average of these assessments will be considered for the aggregate marks.

- Only overall toppers from each class (combining all sections A, B, C, etc.) will be eligible.
- Students must achieve **A1 grades** in all subjects.
- Students appearing for improvement examinations will not be considered.
- Students should not be absent for any examinations conducted during the academic year.

1.2 Classes X & XII

Selection Criteria:

- Performance in all examinations conducted during the academic year 2025-26 will be considered.
- Only overall toppers from each class (combining all sections A, B, C, etc.) will be eligible.
- Students must achieve **A1 grades** in all subjects.
- Students appearing for improvement examinations will not be considered.
- School toppers securing **1st, 2nd, and 3rd positions** in Board Examinations will be recognized.
- Subject toppers in **Class 10 & 12 Board Examinations** will also be recognized separately.

2. CO-CURRICULAR EXCELLENCE AWARDS

Selection Criteria:

- Points earned through participation in Co-curricular Activities (CCA) and Sports events.
- Points scored in inter-school competitions will be given additional weightage.
- Consistent participation and excellence across multiple domains will be considered.
- Special recognition for outstanding achievements at the national level.

3. STUDENT OF THE YEAR AWARD

Selection Criteria:

- Academic performance across Classes **X, XI, and XII** will be evaluated
- Participation and achievements in Sports, Games, and CCA in Classes **X, XI, and XII**.
- Special weightage for exemplary performance in National & International events.
- Service to school and community engagement will be recognized.
- Leadership roles as School Office Bearers will be considered.

Weightage Distribution:

- Academics: **60%**
- CCA & Games/Sports: **35%**
- Leadership positions (School/House Office Bearers): **5%**

Points for Leadership Positions:

- School Head Boy/Girl: **5 marks**
- School Deputy Head Boy/Girl: **3 marks**
- Other positions (House Captains, etc.): **1 mark**
- In case of points earned in multiple years (Class **XI and XII**), the maximum marks will be considered.

4. BEST ATHLETE AWARD

Selection Criteria:

Total Points Calculation:

- Cumulative points earned in the current academic year from Annual Athletic Meet, Inter-House, Cluster, and National events.

CBSE Oman Cluster Competitions:

- Highest individual performance in each competition will be considered.
- Points allocation: **Gold (7 points), Silver (5 points), Bronze (3 points)**.
- All individual athletic events and relay performances will be counted.

Annual Athletic Meet Performance:

- Individual performance in each event will be considered.
- Points allocation: **Gold (7 points), Silver (5 points), Bronze (3 points)**

5. NATIONAL LEVEL PARTICIPATION SUPPORT POLICY

As part of our commitment to nurturing exceptional talent and encouraging students to compete at the highest levels, Indian School Sur will implement the following policy.

Financial Support Guidelines:

- Students who qualify for National level competitions in sports will receive financial sponsorship from the school
- The school will cover 50% of the total expenses incurred for participation in national-level events.
- This includes registration fees, travel, accommodation, and other essential expenses related to the competition

IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

- Class teachers will maintain records of academic performances
- CCA and Sports departments will document participation and achievements, which will be scrutinized by the class teacher.
- A dedicated Award Committee will verify and evaluate all nominations.
- Final selections will be approved by the Principal and presented to the School Management Committee.
- Awards will be presented during the Annual Day ceremony.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS:

- An athlete can participate only in two track events, two field events and relay events.
- Minimum 4 athletes are required for conducting an individual event and in relay
- The Merit Certificates will be awarded only up to 3rd position.
- Points will be awarded up to the 4th position.
- A separate prize may be given to the Individual Champion in the Boys and Girls section, in all the age categories.
- The Individual Champion (Best athlete) in any age group will be awarded only to one athlete on the basis of performance/points as per the AFI Scoring Table.


